# Be part of the development of a Core Outcome Set for treatment studies of provoked vestibulodynia!

A Core Outcome Set (COS) is an agreed-upon standardised collection of outcomes which should be measured and reported, as a minimum, in all trials of a specific condition regardless of the type of treatment being studied. The aim of developing and implementing a COS is that the results from various studies can be more readily comparable and collated, so that the basis for decisions, for patients and healthcare personnel, is therefore strengthened.

In this project, relevant stakeholders are to agree upon a COS for future treatment studies on persons with provoked vestibulodynia.

We want to include persons with the following perspectives:

- · Persons with experience of provoked vestibulodynia
- Relatives of those with experience of provoked vestibulodynia
- Healthcare staff
- Researchers
- Others (patient associations, research funders, systematic reviewers, HTA-personnel, decision-makers and industry).

# What does participation involve?

SBU will summarise a list of the outcomes that are used in research in this area. All persons in the panel will receive two surveys, in which you are asked to rank how important you think the different outcomes are. There will also be a possibility to suggest outcomes that are not listed.
